
INSIDER TIPS

Don't miss decadent housemade pastries like sweet burs made with a chocolate cream filiing at Hot L. Coffee, the hotel's lobby coffee shop. If weather permits, sip a beer in the open-air Quoriset hut, or take a dip in the pool.

Opened in November, this hotel manages to feel like a hidden gem and the city's newest "it" spot all at once. Tucked away in plain sight, its lobby and restaurant sit in an unassuming building just off the intersection of Barton Springs Road and South Lamar Boulevard. The space is the former home of the Carpenters Union Local 1266, a union hall built in 1948 where carpenters once socialized and paid dues. Reimagined as a boutique hotel, The Carpenter Hotel features 93 rooms housed behind the original structure and a restaurant (nostalgically named Carpenters Hall) helmed by James Beard Award-nominated chef Grae Nonas, Have dinner à deux in the cozy dining room-its steak frites and mushroom-topped pappardelle are standout dishes—then retire to the lobby to sink into the soft-as-butter vintage Italian leather chairs and pick a vinyl for the community record player. All of the guest rooms are decorated in beautiful earth tones, with walkout terraces where you

can stand and hear the sounds of the city, and beds with woven Indian blankets perfect for snuggling.

The hotel's outdoor pool resides next to its 93 rooms.

Worried that the tent will be too chilly in the wintertime? Each unit has a wood-burning stove, space heater, and electric heated blanket to keep you warm and toasty.

Less than an hour's drive from Austin, this woodsy resort feels more like Colorado than the Hill Country. Unplug from technology and explore the intimate glamping destination, officially opened last September, which features 12 luxe tents with plush king-size beds and en suite bathrooms with showers, ultra-soft his-and-hers robes, and private decks with Adirondack chairs overlooking the 225-acre Montesino Ranch. Hike around the property's verdant trails to work up an appetite before a stellar five-course farm-to-table dinner featuring hearty proteins (think ribeye from grass-fed cattle and chili made with wild boar) and organic produce plucked from the neighboring ranch. You might hear the faint sounds of howling coyotes or gobbling wild turkeys in

Guests can dine outdoors while enjoying views of scenic Montesino Ranch. the distance as you end your night roasting s'mores under the stars. In the morning, wake up early to see the sunrise together or arrange to receive a free farm-fresh breakfast in your room. With add-ons like in-tent couples' massages, ziplining, and horseback riding, the Wimberley resort is an easy place to bond with your better half.

Get ready to unplug. Miraval Austin limits the use of cellphones to guest rooms and designated common areas to promote mindfulness.

Surrounded by the lush Balcones Canyonlands Preserve, Miraval Austin is breathtaking in its beauty. The 220-acre property, which opened in January in the space formerly occupied by West Austin resort Travaasa, is awash with cedar and oak trees and gorgeous hilltop views of Lake Travis. While Miraval is nestled in a serene landscape perfect for relaxation, adventure is the name of the game at this experiential resort. Team up with your significant other for an array of stimulating activities such as hatchet throwing, archery, kayaking, tarot card readings, vegetable harvesting at on-site Cypress Creek Farm, floating meditation, and horse painting (literally: painting the side of a horse as a
